BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMEN

REGULAR MEETING

July 10, 2017

The Board of Mayor and Aldermen (BMA) met in Regular Session on Monday, July 10, 2017, at 7:00 p.m., at Town Hall, 23 Boone Street, Jonesborough, TN.

Mayor Wolfe called the meeting to order and led the group in an opening prayer.

Members of Troop 112 Boy Scouts led the pledge to the Flag. Mayor Wolfe said there were present because they are working on their Eagle Scout.

Upon call of the roll those present were: Mayor Kelly Wolfe, Alderman Terry Countermine, and Alderman David Sell. Alderman Jerome Fitzgerald was absent. Also present were: Town Administrator Bob Browning, Town Recorder Abbey Miller, Operations Manager Craig Ford, and Town Attorney Jim Wheeler.

The next item on the agenda was the Consent Agenda. Mayor Wolfe asked if there were any items that the Aldermen wished to have pulled from the Consent Agenda. There were none. Alderman Countermine made the motion, seconded by Alderman Vest and duly passed to approve the following items:

- 7. Approve the hiring of Sheri Lunceford as a Dispatcher at Grade 4 Step 1, \$24,675, subject to all pre-employment conditions.

Approve moving the position of Assistant Senior Center Director to Grade 14 and Kathy Crawford's compensation at Grade 14 Step 1 (\$40,193) retroactive to the second reading of the budget, while reducing the Health Promotion line item in the Senior Center budget by an equal amount when budget amendments are formally addressed.
- 9. Approve moving the Park Maintenance Supervisor position to Grade 13, and Bobby Oliver's compensation to Grade 13, Step 3 with a reduction to take place in Park Development Maintenance through budget amendments.
- Accept the retirement of Kenneth Harris, Custodian/Maintenance Worker II with the effective date of July 7, 2017.

11. Approve the Special Events Permit application from the International Storytelling Center to hold the National Storytelling Festival, October 5-8, 2017, with Main Street and associated streets from Fox Street to 2nd Avenue being closed early Friday morning through Sunday evening, Sabine Avenue, Spring Street from Franklin Avenue to Main Street Friday and Saturday evenings, and Boone Street to be included in the Festival boundary with a festival speed limit of 5 mph subject to the Town Attorney's review and approval of the Hold Harmless Policy and Proof of Insurance.

The next item on the agenda was the approval of the Financial Report. Mayor Wolfe asked Abbey Miller about the status of the Town's finances. Ms. Miller said all is going well. She said her staff is getting post cards ready to send out reminders of taxes due. Motion was made by Alderman Vest, seconded by Alderman Sell and duly passed to approve the Financial Report as presented.

Mayor Comments was the next item on the agenda. Mayor Wolfe said Jonesborough Days was great this year. He said Melinda Copp deserves applause. He thanked the Police Department, Fire Department, Park and Recreation, Street Department, Solid Waste Department, Main Street staff, and Tourism Department. He said he met people that were from out of town and they expressed how incredible Jonesborough was and said they were thinking about moving to Jonesborough. He expressed how incredible the event was.

Mayor Wolfe said there is a group of ladies present with the Daughters of American Revolution. He said Ms. Jane Matthews, was the librarian at West View School when he attended that school. She said she was firm but she had a giving heart, showed love to kids, and was a tough lady. He asked the DAR group to come forward. Carol Redmond introduced Mary Nell Robertson, who is 91 years old and is the Historian, Ms. Jane Matthews is the disciplinarian, and Ms. Theresa James. He read the following Proclamation.
